



School Profile 2023-2024

Type of School: Loyola High School of Los Angeles, founded in 1865, is an all-male, four-year, Catholic college preparatory school directed by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Typically, 99% of graduates go directly to higher education including 96% to four-year colleges. Current enrollment is 1275 including a senior class of 300.

Faculty: Loyola employs 117 faculty, administrators, and counselors who all hold advanced professional degrees. Among these educators, 81 have Master's degrees and 17 have earned doctoral degrees.

Accreditation and Memberships: Western Association of Schools and Colleges, Western Catholic Educational Association, Jesuit Schools Network, National Catholic Education Association, the College Board, NACAC, WACAC.

School Community: Loyola is located in the 90006 zip code of central Los Angeles and draws students from the city center and suburbs. Admission into Loyola is achieved by entrance examination, recommendations, and primary school grades. Typically, 125 primary schools are represented in a freshman class that draws from an applicant pool representing over 225 schools. Approximately 50% of those who apply are accepted. Loyola's tuition is \$24,530 for 2023-24. The student body consists of 54.2% who identify their ethnicity as something other than Caucasian including 20.2% Hispanic, 14.4% Asian/Pacific Islander, 5.3% African-American, and 14.3% Multiracial. First-generation college applicants comprise 168 students which represents 13.2% of the student body population.

Curriculum: Courses required for graduation include eight semesters of English and Theology; six of Mathematics, Foreign Language, Science, and Social Science; and two semesters of Fine Arts and Health/PE. 130 course options are offered over 461 sections, 91 of which are Advanced Placement and 47 designated as Honors. Students are enrolled in seven courses per semester with four sections meeting per day each 65-minutes in duration. The average class size is 20.72 students per section. 135 hours of community service across four years are a requirement for graduation.

Advanced Courses available to the Class of 2024: With the exception of AP World History during the sophomore year, students must be accepted into Honors and AP courses based on previous academic performance and evaluations completed by previous instructors. Students do not have open access to Honors and AP courses.
